- Water speed and depths
- Traveling vs. holding steelhead

How to play a fish/ fish take - KAIT/MIA

- Set to the side and toward the bank if possible/ rod angles
- Let the fish take 10 ft. or count 10 seconds
- Hoarse vs. proper fight for quick release
- Soft take/blistering takes/ big buck takes/ fish jumps
- To lift or not to lift

How to land a big fish and Methods and Proper Fish Handling - MIA/KAIT

- Keep-em' Wet principles
- Rod pointed upstream/ brush behind you
- Tailing a fish
- Being calm

What is the Casting stroke?

- Holding Rod
- Facing target
- Work on Roll Cast, Snap-T, Double Spey

CASTING FAULTS AND HOW TO FIX Pulling anchors, Bloody L, trunking and more

- Line management D-Loop and forward cast (180 degree rule)
- Anchor placement brush behind you and water speeds
- Evaluate anglers casting and help with issues
